
CHRIST CHURCH GIRLS' HIGH SCHOOL (H.S)














Here's Looking at us

The date of the origin of Christ Church Girl's High School (H.S.) might be traced even much before the date of its official existence. In the days of child marriage, female infanticide, widow-burning, purdah system, - when emancipation of women was a dream even undreamt of; was set up Christ Church Girls' High School (H.S.). She indeed owes her birth to one energetic Lady Missionary, Miss Henrietta J. Neele and her associate Miss Alice Sampson, who came down all the way to India from the Church Missionary Society, London. The school was then located at Christ Church Parsonage, 182, Cornwallis Square Kolkata.





After Miss Sampson and Miss Wolley, Miss Rachel Taylor occupied the stage and it was during her tenure in 1932 that the school was shifted to the present site to meet a real need of the locality. During the Second World War the school campus had been requisitioned by the army and was shifted to Krishnanagar Queen's School, Nadia for a brief period. Miss A. L. Chrestien took over charge from Miss A. H. Kempson in 1942 and was the first Indian incumbent designated as Principal of the school

Finally the school got reshifted to its own premises in Dum Dum and the seedling that was planted 138 years ago by Miss Neele, gradually transformed into a gigantic tree firmly rooted and grown not merely in size during the years, but also in her role of educating and emancipating women, which was further carried on by the valuable contribution of Miss A.S. Mammen from 1956 to 1986.



The charge was then passed on to Mrs. Sucheta Roy followed by Mrs. Simanti Gonsalves, (Teacher-in-charge). Both of them also contributed immensely towards the betterment of this institution.

At present, Mrs. Helen S. Sircar has taken up charge as Principal of this prestigious institution. Since Dec, 2011 Under her leadership, the school has taken a giant leap forward keeping in mind the needs of the present era. The school, under her able guidance has undertaken the humungous challenge of the gradual conversion from a Bengali

medium to an English medium school from the Academic Year 2018 onwards. At present (Classes Transition to VII) have English as the medium of instruction, and in the following years they will proceed as English medium students and sit for their Board **Examinations i.e. West** Bengal Board of **Secondary Education**



(Class X) and West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education (Class XII) with English as their medium of instruction.

Primary - 10.00 a.m. to 2.30. p.m.


Secondary & Higher Secondary - 10.00 am to 4.15 p.m.

- Pupils must be punctual and regular in their attendance.
- It is compulsory for all students to attend the assembly before the classes begin.
- Assembly is an integral part of the Curriculum. All children must attend Assembly regularly.
- No pupil will be allowed to leave school during school hours.
- Children who are absent for more than one month are liable to have their names struck off the School Rolls in the absence of any written application along with supportive documents.
- Leave of absence for birthdays, marriage feasts, going for a pleasure trip and similar reasons will strictly not be entertained.
- During Half-Yearly and Annual Evaluation a student has to appear in all subjects, otherwise promotion to the next class may not be granted.
- Promotion is granted on the basis of the whole year's performance of the pupil, hence
 the importance of regularity in attendance and performance. The decision of the
 school authority with regard to promotion is final. Result, once published, is not
 amended.
- Students are strictly not permitted to give personal gifts to any member of the staff. (Teaching or Non-Teaching)
- No Mobile phones, gold ornaments, expensive pens / pencil boxes / watches / waterbottles etc. shall be brought to school The school will not be held responsible for the loss of any such item.
- The school emphasizes not only on the academic development of a child but also on her overall development, which necessarily includes character building and discipline.
- The conduct of the student on the way to and from school in the school bus, in the play field, Assembly and at all school functions should be exemplary.

The pupils of Christ Church Girls' High School (H.S.) are expected to behave in a lady like manner on all occasions. They should address all members of the staff with due respect and politeness. They must show gentleness and courtesy to their companions. Refinement of manners and uprightness and self restraint should be inherent character of every pupil of the school.



and provides connectivity to the Internet.




















School Auditorium: The School has a spacious auditorium with a seating capacity of 600, catering to various programmes held throughout the year.




Medical Room: The school has a well-equipped room for students who are unwell during the school hours. We also have a registered Medical Practitioner who is called for, as and when the need arises.
